Governmental Affairs Report

It is a whole new legislative session in New York State and that means new bill numbers.

Assemblymember sponsor Michaelle Solages (District 22) continues to be a strong sponsor for us. She quickly submitted our legislation in early January, and received our new assembly bill number, A219.

We also have a new Senate sponsor, Senator Jamaal Bailey (36th District), and we have senate bill number \$942. Senator May has chosen to focus on her area of expertise, Environmental Bills. We thank her for all her work and dedication to our efforts these last four years.



Now that we have bill numbers (A219, S942), we ask you to sign the Get in the Game letter. We know, we have asked this in previous years, but when it is a brand-new bill number (and a new sponsor), we need you, and all your friends, all your work colleagues, all your family members in NYS, and all your athletes to sign at the website. The more people who sign it, the better. It shows the support for our bill and will make a difference. And of course, list your credentials! It is a show of solidarity when NYSATA ATs sign on to support this legislation.

As the legislative session ramps up, they will first focus on the budget, and we and our lobbyist (Karin Carreau) will continue to educate members, especially new ones elected in November. We will continue to need your help. Be on the lookout for emails and VoterVoice contacts and please do the simple requests we send out.

NYSATA Legislative Update

On Tuesday, January 10, 2023, Governor Kathy Hochul delivered her State of the State address in a jam-packed Assembly Chamber filled with legislators, commissioners, judges from Court of Appeals, and invited guests. The event was in stark contrast to last year's delivery of her State of the State when she delivered it in a nearly empty Assembly chamber as New York fought the Omicron wave of the COVID-19 public health emergency. While the address has customarily been delivered on the opening day of the Legislative Session, which was January 4, 2023, Governor Hochul delayed the address until January 10. The

near hour-long address highlighted a small fraction of the 147 policy proposals that are part of her plan outlined in a 275-page book. The State of the State lays out a plan for policies to, as Governor Hochul put it, "... make New York more affordable, more livable, and safer."

On a fiscal note, the State of the State recognizes the looming potential for a recession as many economists predict, noting the investments made to the state's rainy-day fund in last year's budget. Governor Hochul made a pledge to not raise income taxes this year.

The entire State of the State Book can be viewed online. A sampling of notable proposals are excerpted in a nine-page summary on the NYSATA website. Carreau Consulting expects greater detail of these proposals when Governor Hochul releases her executive budget proposal later this month (a date and time has not yet been publicly confirmed for such release, however, it must constitutionally be on or before February 1).

Outside of the pomp and circumstance of the State of the State address, your NYSATA Governmental Affairs Team has been working behind the scenes with key legislators and their staff during the run up to the 2023 legislative session to continue advancing the organization's priorities, primarily, the licensure bill and also the implementation and potential continuation of the legislatively funded COPE (Concussion Outreach Prevention Education) initiative.

There are a number of changes in the legislative terrain this year, primary among such changes that impact NYSATA's work, is a changing of the guard with respect to the Assembly Chair of Higher Education. Longtime Chair of the Committee, Debra Glick has been appointed to Chair the Environmental Conservation Committee, as such, Assembly member Pat Fahy (D-Albany) will step into the role of Higher Education Committee Chair. Moments after learning of this, we reached out to schedule a meeting with the new Chair. We also have a new Senate Sponsor for our licensure bill, in Jamaal Bailey (D -Bronx). We are very excited to work with both the new Chair and our new Senate Sponsor.

It is important to keep in mind that every two-year session requires previously introduced bills to be reintroduced and indexed with new numbers. The 2023-24 numbers for the licensure bills are: A219 / S942. The re-introduced bills do not automatically include all previous co-sponsors, as members of the body change every two years as well. As such, it is important that you take the five minutes to call your representatives to request they co-sponsor the bills. You can find your Senate and Assemblymembers online.



In January, Lake Placid welcomed 2500 athletes and coaches representing 50 countries to

compete in the 11 day FISU World University Games. Collegiate athletes from over 600 universities around the world competed in 86 medal events. 

I would like to thank HWS for allowing me to attend the World University Games to share this experience with Coach Taylor, Luke and Cooper."





Schram was joined at the games by Hobart Hockey Head Coach Mark Taylor, sophomore forward Luke Aquaro, and sophomore defenseman Cooper Swift.

The women's team played in a six team pool at Potsdam Maxcy Hall. Joining the US team were Japan, Czechia, Great Britain, Slovakia and Canada. The women finished pool play with a 2-3 record and were unable to make the medal round.

The men's team entered the tournament as the No. 6 seed, and went 5-2 on their way to winning a silver medal. The Americans won their pool at Clarkson University's Cheel Arena with a 4-1 mark, collecting wins over Great Britain, Korea, Kazakhstan and Hungary, with the lone loss against Slovakia. The United States then defeated Japan 4-3 in overtime to secure a spot in the gold medal game. Facing a loaded Canadian team, which had seven NHL draft picks on its roster, the Americans fell 7-2.

Reflecting on her experience, Schram recalled how surreal it felt walking around the 1980 rink with the entire USA team during the opening ceremony. It was a quick whirlwind three day "pre-season," followed by twelve total games covered, with practices in between. She was amazed at how quickly that went.

The memory that Schram will remember most, however, will be walking through the tunnel to the bench for the gold medal game in a sold out arena with fans chanting "USA, USA, USA!" She said it was a breathtaking moment that she will never forget!
